# THE GHOSTS OF SILVER ISLET

**O**n a sunlit autumn day the winding drive onto Sibley Peninsula is nothing short of spiritual. Surrounded by golden sienna forest, big blue sky overhead, venturing out to the Sleeping Giant this time of year is glorious. Occasionally the keen eyes of wild animals and birds take note of your passage as, innocently enough, you make your way to Thunder Cape. But be forewarned. In October, out here even on the sunniest of days shadows lengthen early. Dusk flies fast. And after nightfall...well, it can be cold as the grave.

I'd first felt the eerie vibe of Silver Islet in summertime: a whispering energy just beyond one's normal sense of hearing. A row of curiously constructed wooden houses perched like unwelcoming birds on a wire, except in this case the wire was a dusty main avenue of sorts. These silent dwellings were best passed slowly, carefully; and not because of the condition of the gravel road.

Some years later, again I was there in daylight, but in early winter. The same whispering energy; spooky stillness. I was drawn to the General Store near the edge of the frozen inlet: a large rather sinister-looking building looming up darkly from the snow midst those shadows I mentioned. I felt particularly uneasy because of its small boarded-up windows: like eyes that couldn't see out. What might the inside of this abandoned building look like now? Had all the beams and upper floors simply decayed into heaps of rubble? Maybe it was completely empty, swept clean of anything but the occasional creak of a shifting foundation.

Imagining energy trapped inside such a space with no daylight sent prickles up my spine. A steep wooden staircase along one of the outer walls beckoned; I ignored the "No Trespassing" sign; ascended as far as I dared. At certain spots I tried to peer through narrow cracks in the lumber, couldn't see a thing. Pitch-black. There was a smell of old, old water. Unexpectedly I heard a rustling noise; it seemed to originate from a ground-level corner of the space, but I couldn't be sure. Then, distinctly, I heard the slow muted whap-whap of wings, gaged the giant wingspan by the sound. Instincts screeching, I jerked back, nearly lost my footing as I clutched the railing.

It took about twenty minutes, I don't know, of gulping in fresh winter air before the shaking stopped; and I could descend. But not before, from this vantage, looking outward, I noticed a bright circle of silver just at the periphery of my gaze.

"Silver Islet is one of Ontario's best kept ghost towns. It is also one of the oldest. A one-time silver mining town on the shores of Lake Superior, a huge deposit of silver was discovered around 1845. There was no easy access to the silver ore deposit for it was located on a small shoal under a limestone mesa called Thunder Cape. Initial efforts to mine the ore all proved futile. It was as though the volatile weather of Lake Superior wanted to deny entrance to the ore deposit for all time to come. Several decades later the battle was joined when a new owner acquired the property. Several breakwaters were built to contain the fury of the lake's waters. They, too, were demolished by storms, ice surges, even a freak tidal wave. Finally, a breakwater of rock and concrete was built that allowed miners to extract silver ore worth \$3 million. In 1883, mining operations ceased for lack of fuel for the furnaces and water filled the shafts." Submitted by: Henry Chenoweth

James Cawdor: apparently his ghost remains trapped in a mineshaft. Prolific Thunder Bay author Bill MacDonald has a wonderfully spooky essay on what really happened to him. Find The Ghost of James Cawdor, or "a séance to contact a dead miner, in 1923 in Port Arthur Ontario, conducted by none other than Sir Arthur Conan Doyle himself" in Geist magazine. A word of advice: if you're alone for the read, be sure to leave a light on after you retire for the night.







The birding at Hurkett Cove Conservation Area is some of the best in Northwestern Ontario. MacKenzie Point Conservation Area is a small rock outcrop into Lake Superior that's perfect for taking in sunrises, and Cedar Falls Conservation Area is a picturesque spot that features a short hike to small waterfalls. Conservation Area visitors are asked to deposit their \$2.00 per vehicle parking fee in the collection box at each visit. Also available is the Explore Card Parking Pass, which allows for free parking at all of the LRCAs seasonal and year-round Conservation Areas for one full year, at a cost of \$30.00 +HST.

### **BOTANICAL CONSERVATORY**

The Centennial Botanical Conservatory is a fascinating place to visit. Opened in 1967 by the Fort William Parks Board as a Centennial project, it is a legacy to the citizens of Thunder Bay. The central and largest room in the Conservatory is the tropical house - a humid arboretum featuring exotic flowers, trees, shrubs and other plants from around the world in a year-round tropical setting. The greenhouses adjacent to the Conservatory are used by staff to raise bedding plants and hanging floral displays for use in Thunder Bay Parks. For a spectacular season floral display, see Hillcrest Park. ## TRAVEL - AUTOMOBILE

**DRIVER'S LICENCE** - A valid licence from any country is valid in Ontario for 3 months.

**SEAT BELTS** - The law in Ontario requires the driver and passengers to wear seat belts if the vehicle is equipped with them.

**SPEED LIMITS** - On highways and expressways, 90 km/h (55 mph) or as posted; in urban and built up areas it's usually 50 km/h (30 mph).

**METRIC CONVERSION** - All mileage and speed limit signs in Ontario are in metric (kilometres). The kilometre is equal to five eighths (5/8) of a mile. To convert miles to kilometres simply multiply the miles by 1.6, eg. 100 miles equals 100x1.6=160 km. Conversely, to convert kilometres to miles, multiply the number of kilometres by .6, eg. 100 km equals 100x.6=60 miles.

**AUTO CLUBS** - The Ontario Motor League is affiliated with the AAA. The membership card from your local AAA branch entitles you to all the benefits of the OML.

**ACCIDENTS** - If you are involved in an accident resulting in a personal injury or property damage over \$1,000 you must notify the police and remain at the scene of the accident until cleared by investigating officers.


