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Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from February 10th–11th, 2024 among a sample of 1121 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Ontario and are eligible to vote in provincial elections. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews using Interactive Voice Recording technology (IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The sample was weighted by age, gender, and region according to the 2021 Census. The survey is intended to represent the adult population in Ontario.

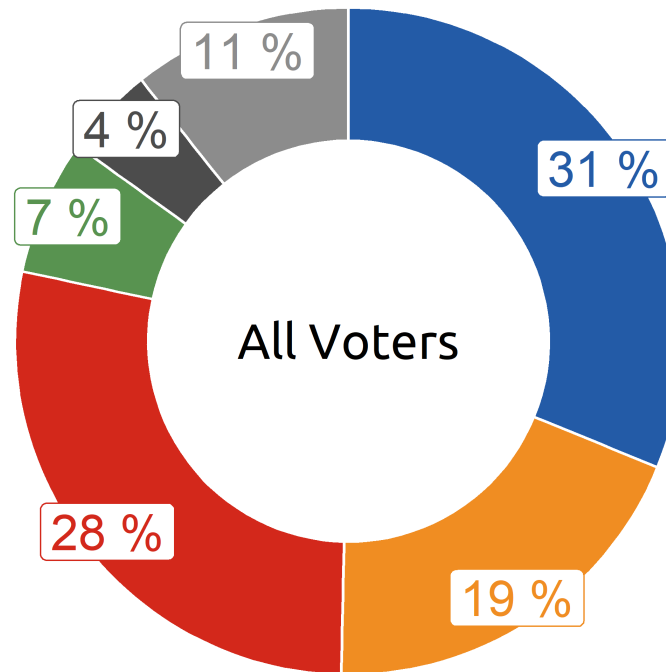
This survey was sponsored by the Trillium.

The margin of error for the poll is $\pm 2.9\%$, at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

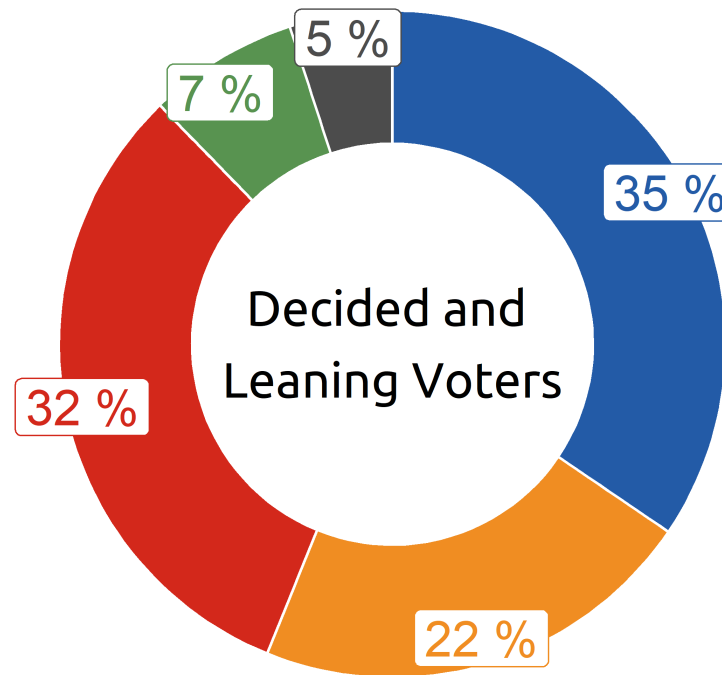
If a provincial election were held today, which party would you vote for?

If a provincial election were held today, which party would you vote for?

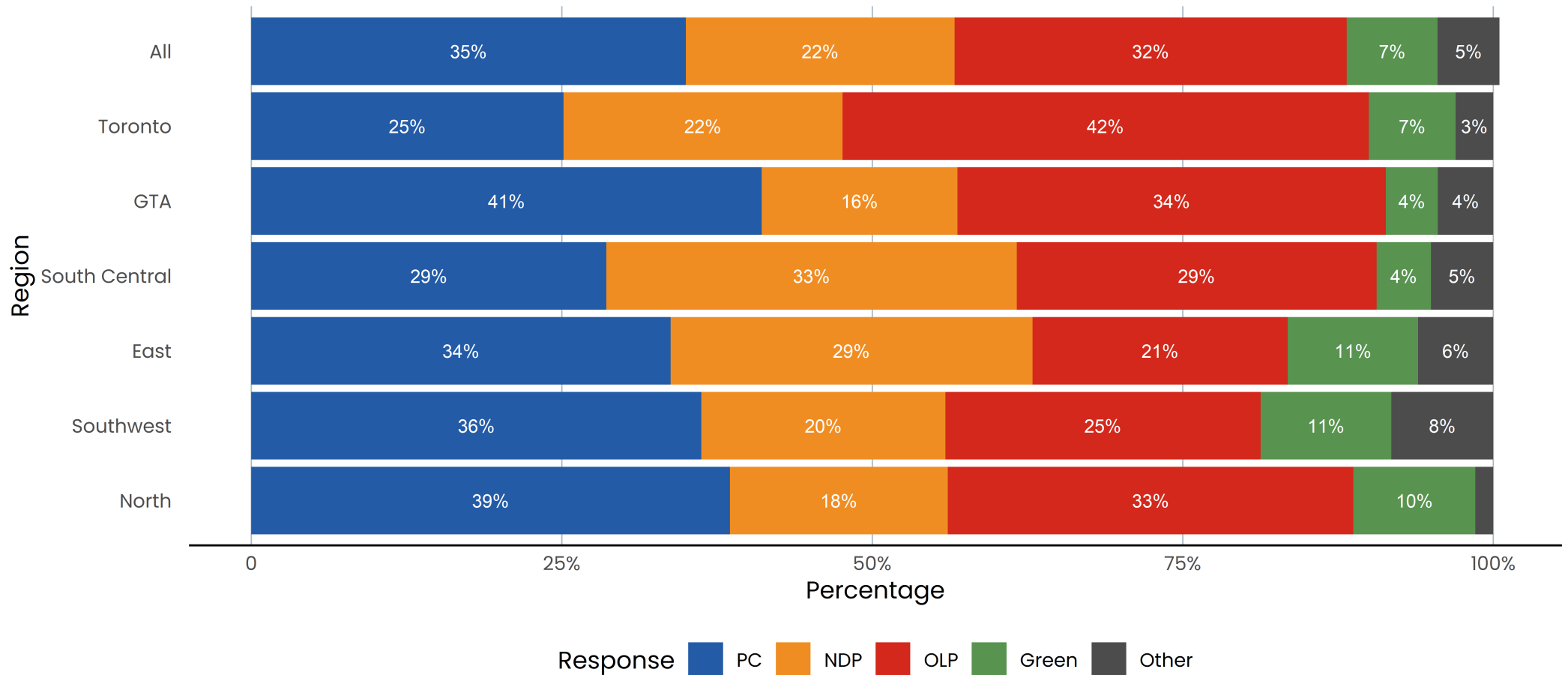

decided and leaning voters - broken out by region

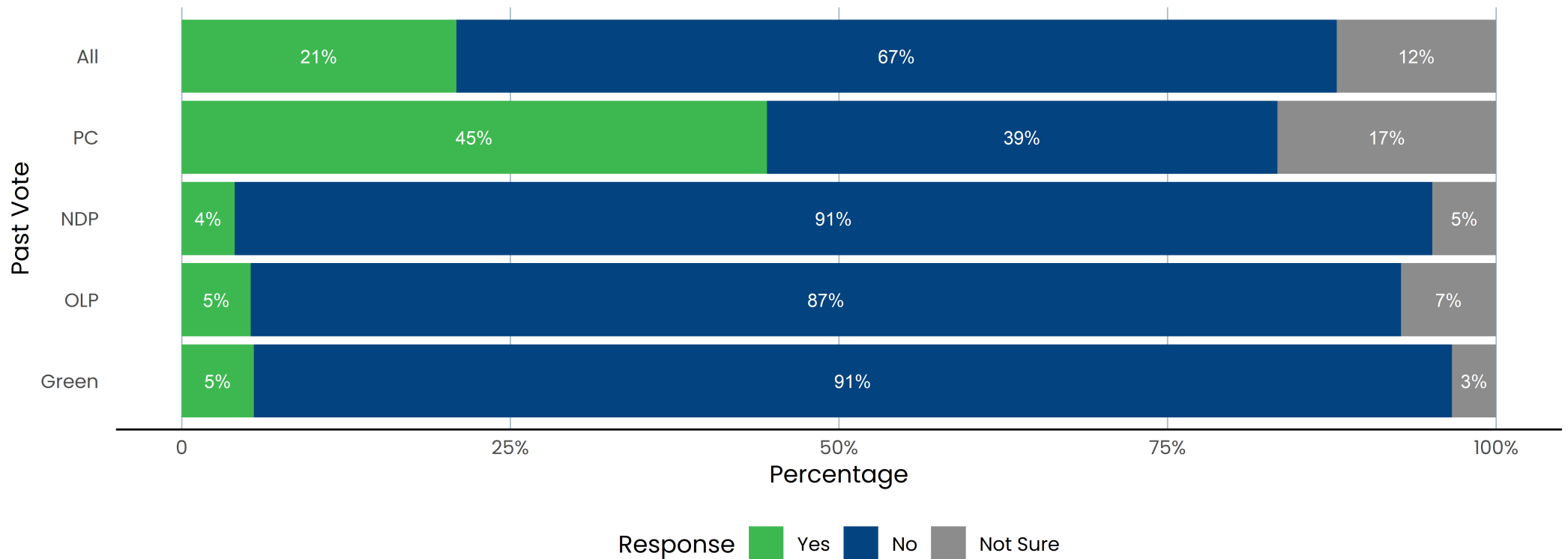


Ford PCs: For The People?

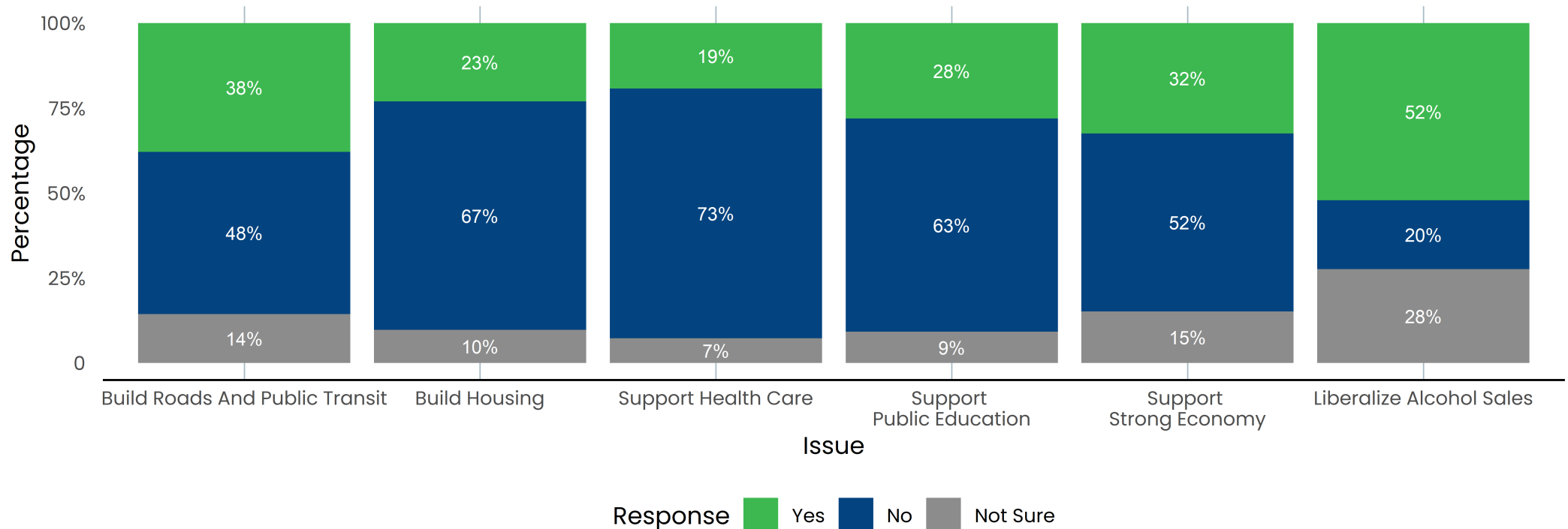
